Fundraiser at Guilford College UMC



What is your involvement with Yokefellow Prison Ministry?

Presently I am serving on the Board of Directors of Yokefellow.

Why did you get involved with YPM? I believe inmates {offenders} are people with great needs that can only be met with the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. Yokefellow is a tremendous platform that provides the volunteer the opportunity to present that gospel. While it is true that Yokefellow is not a "preaching" type of service, I believe the gospel is clearly being preached through the volunteers' love, concern and being there for the inmates. Tell us about your life ministry and call to ministry. Presently, I work a day job as a machine operator at the Bob Barker Company in Fuquay Varina. I serve on the Ministry Team there and stay very busy in work and activities that we are providing as the Ministry Team. I also pastor a small fellowship in Benson, NC. For years I knew God had a calling on my life. 2 Timothy 1:9 was the scripture that God spoke to my heart about my call. Since being ordained in 2008, God has opened many doors and has provided numerous opportunities to share the Word of God and my testimony. And finally, I am happily married to my wife Cheryl. Strong in faith and steadfast in perseverance, she has truly been my good and perfect gift from above. I am a blessed man in having her as my wife.

What is something that most people don't know about you? Though I have a laid back personality and am mild mannered for the most part, I am very competitive. I also



don't play around when I get into something or commit to something. Always been that way. When it came to sports, when it came to running, when it came to doing drugs (prior to my conversion), I have always been gung ho. Now thank the Lord, my commitment to the Lord Jesus and to the Word of God are the driving passions of my life. Finally, what some may not know about me is that I spent over 26 years in the NC Department of Corrections. The second day of my incarceration is when I gave my heart to the Lord Jesus Christ, it was by far the best decision I will have made for all eternity.

Is there anything you would like to add? We don't get but so many days on this terrestrial ball called Earth. The Apostle Paul said "Whatsoever we do, do heartily as to the Lord and not unto men." Everything that doesn't have eternal value truly is but temporal. I try to remind myself of this often. I try to enjoy life and the blessings God has bestowed upon me. But most of all, the longing of my heart is to just please Him. He is so deserving of it all and so much more.


#GivingTuesday Fundraiser through Facebook
