MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Recently, while reading through our Yokefellow Prison Ministry website, I was reminded of our wonderful opportunities to serve the Lord. We are called to be disciplined in our devotion and service. Here's a bit of what I read, and all of these serve as wonderful reminders.

Yokefellow Prison Ministry is an interdenominational, racially-diverse Christian ministry of reconciliation begun in 1969, which in-



cludes both lay and clergy, male and female. It is founded on the idea that people's lives are changed through committed relationships. The Biblical foundation of our commitment is the invitation by Christ our Lord in the Gospel of Matthew 11:29-30.

Yokefellows voluntarily accept a common discipline in living the Christian life, which includes:

- Prayer To pray every day, preferably at the beginning of the day.
- Scripture To seek God's guidance through reverent reading of the Bible every day, following a definite plan.
- Worship To participate, at least once a week, in public worship of God.

- Money To return to God a definite portion of my income to support the Christian cause.

- Witness To make an unapologetic witness in daily life, daily work, daily words.
- Study To become a betterinformed Christian by careful study of Christian books.

Yokefellows commit themselves to participate in a weekly Yokefellow meeting for sharing, support, encouragement and accountability for Christian growth.

Committee, grantors and foundations, churches, organizations, and individuals who support our work and ministry prayerfully and financially.
