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## Yokefellow Prison Ministry Lauches Residential Reentry Facility Meetings

Did you know that Yokefellow Prison Ministry launched a new version of our Yokefellow Meetings hosted in partner Residential Reentry ("Transitional Post Release Facilities") across North Carolina?

This new program launched in the fall of 2021, as a way to revision what Yokefellow Prison Ministry is and who it could reach as the ongoing pandemic continued to prevent volunteers from reaching our primary target, incarcerated people in the traditional correctional facilities.

These meeting follow the same Yokefellow Meeting model as what is brought to individuals in the prisons only these meetings are hosted in the common areas of the residences. Meetings are focused on the post prison stage and looking on towards helping individuals be successful once

they are fully returned to society in leading whole, productive lives and not returning to incarceration.

Currently, the Transitional Residential Facility Meetings are being held at residential facilties in Durham, New Bern, Greensboro, and Rocky Mount. Yokefellow staff is working towards expanding this program to additional facilities including Wilmington, Raleigh, Fayetteville and more in the year 2022. It is our goal to be able to reach every person possible and to share the hope and redemption that can be found in Christ Jesus when we turn our lives over to Him.

# A Letter from the President of the Board




# Introducing the Faithful Fifty Tier as Part of the Faithful Friends Monthly Sustainer Program

Yokefellow Prison Ministry of North Carolina is blessed and honored to celebrate 50 years as a registered nonprofit organization in the State of North Carolina in 2022. Yokefellow Prison Ministry was established in 1969 by Rev. Jerry Murray (right) and three other pastors who had travelled to Pennsylvania to hear the founder of the Yokefellow movement, Dr. Elton Trueblood, speak about the importance of prison ministry and the need to share the livesaving message of Jesus with incarcerated people.

Rev. Murray was a lifelong resident of North Carolina and a dedicated Christian who loved God and God's people. Jerry was active with Yokfellow Prison Ministry until his death in 2020. His family, particularly his widow, Mrs. Nancy Murray, continue to support and pray for Yokefellow Prison Ministry and the continuation of the work that Rev. Murray began to reach North Carolina's incarcerated people and change their lives. Rev. Murray believed that, through changing the hearts of people, and leading individuals to renewed and reformed lives Yokefellow Prison Ministry would make a major impact in his beloved home state.
