





A Letter from the President of the Board


Dear Friends,




Local Coordinators

We need your help to ensure that our staff and our Yokefellow volunteers are kept informed of any scheduling changes so that we can all plan accordingly.

Also, if you are aware of a facility that has not yet permitted volunteers to return that is planning to begin doing so OR your facility is planning "Blue Card" training please make sure that Carlton Gooding is advised of this so that we can help potential volunteers make arrangements.

Lastly, if you know of anyone who is interested in ministering to our incarcerated people either in the



prison facilities or a residential reentry facility please see that they get in touch with Carlton to complete the required Yokefellow Prison Ministry in-house training. Yokefellow Prison Ministry has facilities that we are still waiting to reenter due to a need for volunteers and we are constantly looking for new locations to minister in but we need trained volunteers in order to do this.
